

St. Mark's, St. Edward's teams capture Hallsiey Invitation



BOISE — Thirty-three teams and hundreds of basketball players from Catholic schools and parishes around the state gathered in sites around Boise Feb. 12-14 for the 47th Annual Hallsiey Invitational.

After dozens of games, the final results were as follows:

- In the Boys' Division, St. Mark's (Boise) eighth graders defeated St. Joseph's (Boise) eighth graders, 40-23;
- In the Girls' Division, St. Mark's (Boise) seventh graders defeated Holy Trinity (Nez Perce), 37-32;
- In the Coed Division, St. Edward's (Twin Falls) defeated Sacred Heart (Boise), 31-17.

Catholic Charities to host 'Peddle Past Poverty'

BOISE — Some groups try to push an envelope. Catholic Charities of Idaho is looking for those willing to push the "pedals".

Catholic Charities USA is sponsoring a national Cycling for Change campaign

that features a cycling team pedalling cross-country to draw awareness to its drive to eliminate poverty in the U.S. by 2020. Cyclists will start in Washington state in May, will enter Idaho on June 11, and after a day of rest, will resume across

the panhandle before entering Montana June 16. The tour is expected to end in Key West, Fla., later in the summer.

To draw attention to that campaign, CCI is planning two separate events.

It is hosting the first annual Peddle Past Poverty series June 3-5 in the Treasure Valley. On June 3 at dusk at the amphitheater at Boise State University, there will be a free showing of "30 Days," a film documenting the difficulties facing a family of four struggling to get by on minimum wage jobs. On June 4, there will be a golf tournament to be held at Shadow Valley on Hwy 55 in Boise. There will also be a poverty simulation in which people can experience the frustration faced every day

by the poor in different environments, for example, in applying for food stamps. On June 5, there will be two cycling events: one for children at a local Boise Catholic school and a longer three-mile event through Boise's North End.

The second event requires recruiting cyclists willing to bike from Boise to Lewiston to meet the CCUSA cycling team as it enters the state. Departing from Boise June 5, cyclists would have six days to traverse the 300 miles to Lewiston.
