BOISE — Catholic schools dominated the field at the Idaho Science Olympiad at Northwest Nazarene University April 4.

Teams from perennial powerhouse Bishop Kelly High School captured the three top spots in the C Division (grades 10-12), earning it a trip to national competition. Teams from St. Joseph School finished first and third in the B Division, (grades 6-9), alternating with teams from St. Mark School, which finished second and fourth. A team from Sacred Heart School finished fifth.

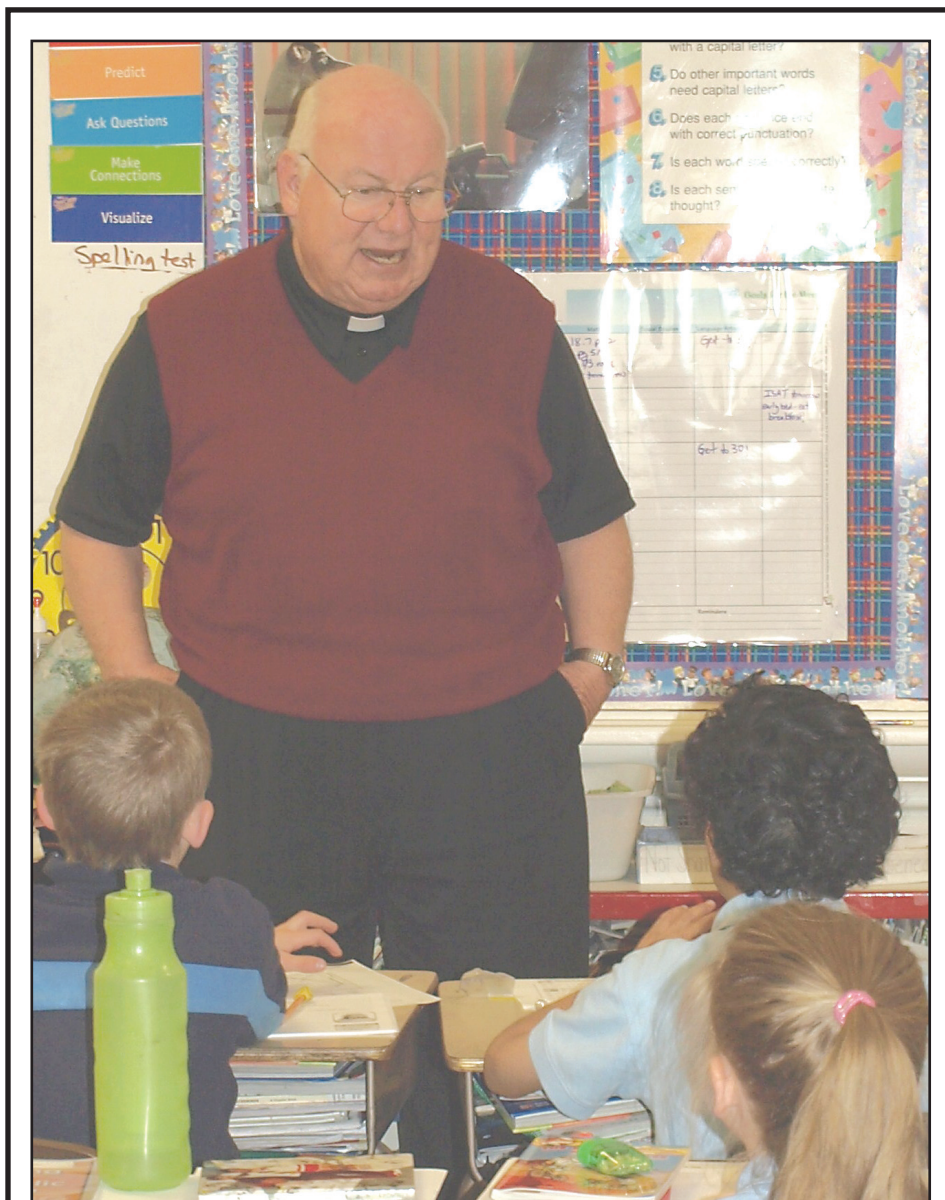
The top St. Joseph's team also went to national competition, set in May, at
